

#### PASTOR'S NOTES . . .

We are approaching All Saint's Day when we remember, in a special way, those whose lives of service, dedication, and sacrifice are examples for us and All Soul's Day, the Commemoration of all the Faithful departed when we remember our loved ones who have gone before us "marked with the sign" of faith.

It is important for many reasons to celebrate these two special days as Catholics. All Saint's Day recalls the heroes of the faith, this year to include two more relatively recent Popes: Pope John XVIII and Paul XVI. "Good Pope John" was known for his jovial personal manner drawn from his humble roots in a poor Italian village. It was his call, inspired by the Holy Spirit, to "open the windows" of the Church to let in fresh air and to restore the Mass to its earliest roots.

In light of the universal priesthood of all believers and this liturgical renewal consider one of the earliest descriptions of the Mass that comes to us from Justin Martyr:

"The apostles, in their recollections, which are called gospels, handed down to us what Jesus commanded them to do. They tell us that he took bread, gave thanks and said: Do this in memory of me. This is my body. In the same way he took the cup, he gave thanks and said: This is my blood. The Lord gave this command to them alone. Ever since then we have constantly reminded one another of these things..." On Sunday we have a common assembly of all our members, whether they live in the city or the outlying districts. The recollections of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as there is time. When the reader has finished, the president of the assembly speaks to us; he urges everyone to imitate the examples of virtue we have heard in the readings. Then we all stand up together and pray.

On the conclusion of our prayer, bread and wine and water are brought forward. The president offers prayers and gives thanks to the best of his ability, and the people give assent by saying, "Amen". The eucharist is distributed, everyone present communicates, and the deacons take it to those who are absent."

Pope Paul continued this work with the Second Vatican Council, beginning a renewal of the faith in which the lay faithful could once again take part. This is a great and holy privilege. When we step outside our comfort zones and participate in the Mass we are fulfilling the command of Jesus to: "Do this in remembrance of Me." We should all be ready to do what we can to support the Mass in whatever way we can: in our prayers, in our attention to the Eucharistic celebration in all of its parts, in the singing, and in our faithful attendance on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
