PASTOR'S NOTES . . .

In today's Gospel, the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, the end of the Christmas Season, Jesus allowed Himself to be baptized by John and the Trinity is revealed when the Father spoke and the Spirit descended upon Jesus.

John preached a baptism of repentance, but Jesus was without sin. Jesus was baptized for other reasons other than repentance from sin.

It was a testimony of Jesus' oneness with sinners. It will mark His ministry. He came for sinners like Matthew, Zacchaeus, Mary Magdalene, the thief, the sick, and every one of us. Whereas John's baptism ends with repentance, Jesus' baptism will find forgiveness for sinners through the dying and resurrection of Jesus. After Jesus' resurrection, baptism will be the way to freedom from Original Sin and the reception of the gift of new life and salvation.

In the Sacrament of Baptism, the person is touched by the priest on the ears and on the lips: "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the mute speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God the Father."

Remembering our own baptism, let us open our ears to receive his word and our lips to proclaim our faith.
