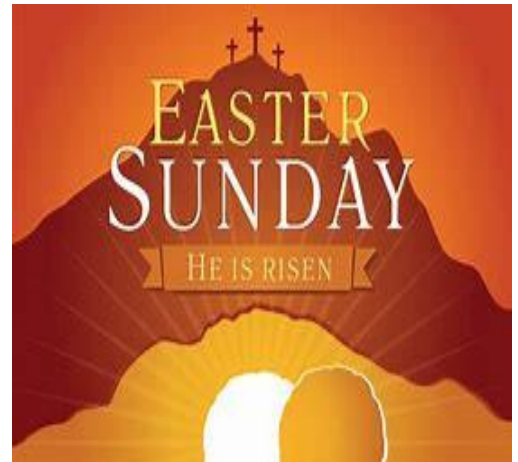

PASTOR'S NOTES . . .

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia, Jesus Christ is Risen from the Dead! Alleluia!

In today's Gospel we see the empty tomb: at first a shock for the disciples, especially those closest to Jesus: Peter, John and the holy women who followed him faithfully. They thought the worst - not only had their Savior died, but now someone had taken his body. Jesus who died and was buried rose on the third day, according to the Scriptures. We have fifty days between today and May 20 - Pentecost Sunday. We can't take it all in at once. Keep coming back. Keep coming to Mass.

Hopefully, Lent has been a time for you to pour out all the harmful, negative ways of thinking that filled your head...I hope you replaced any stockpiles of anger, guilt and resentment with peace, happiness and forgiveness. Most all, may you count God in rather than counting God out, especially when darkness descends.

Pour out all that is harmful, negative. St. Paul tells us to get rid of the old leaven - the yeast of malice. At Passover time Jewish people scour their homes to remove any particle of yeast and leavened bread. Like them we want to make a new beginning. Easter is victory for every person with an open, believing heart.

At this Sunday's Mass, and last night at the Easter Vigil we renewed our Baptismal promises: We renounce Satan, all his works and all his empty promises, we reject sin so as to live in the freedom of God's children, we reject the glamor of evil, and refuse to be mastered by sin, we reject Satan father of sin and prince of darkness. Then we move on to the positive aspects of our Baptismal promises: We say clearly: I believe in God the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth, in Jesus Christ, his only Son, Our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, was crucified, died and was buried, rose from the dead and is now seated at the right hand of the Father. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins and life everlasting. This is our faith; this is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it in Jesus Christ Our Lord. As our Psalm says, "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." Amen.
