PASTOR'S NOTES . . .

The Gospel for today is the opening passage of what we call the Farewell Discourse in the Gospel of John. At the Last Supper the feet of the disciples have been washed, Judas has left the room and Jesus has predicted Peter's denial; at this point Jesus begins a long discourse which extends over four chapters of John's gospel.

This Farewell Discourse is a kind of last instruction for his disciples during which Jesus sums up his teaching, tries to give them reassurance and prepares them for the dramatic events of the next couple of days. (His arrest, suffering and death.) The language used is often very tender and it is clear that Jesus is speaking to them with a heavy heart but with great love.

The first part of this Gospel passage is very frequently used for funerals. The text reads, "There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I would have told you. I am going now to prepare a place for you, and after I have gone and prepared a place for you, I shall return to take you with me; so that where I am you may be also." These words have given great comfort to many Christians in their hour of grief when a loved one has passed away. These words of Jesus fill us all with hope, in the face of death, whether that of our loved ones or our own.

Reassuring as these words of Jesus are which tell us about life beyond the grave, we should remember that our faith is not simply about preparing for death. Rather it is primarily about how to live the Christian life and all the challenges that it brings us.

Jesus is telling us that we need to place our whole selves in his hands right now. He lays down instructions and guidance on how to live in the world and, most importantly, that what we ought to be doing is imitating him in every aspect of his own life on earth. It is by living our lives like he lived his that we become more like him and be prepared to enter our heavenly home.

JEFFERSON CITY — The Diocese of Jefferson City warns the public of what appears to be an ongoing phishing scam involving emails and texts purportedly from priests or parish/Chancery staff. This scam has hit many parishes across the United States. The email or text purports to be from a person the target knows, such as one's pastor, a parish staff member, the bishop or someone else from the Church. If the target responds to the fake email or text, the sender will follow up with a request for some sort of monetary assistance, often for gift cards or iTunes cards. It is truly unfortunate cyber criminals will attempt to exploit the generous nature of our community. Sending emails or texts asking for cash or gifts cards is not how priests, parishes or the Diocese of Jefferson City seeks financial assistance for our work. If you receive an email or text from a trusted church personnel asking for assistance, confirm by calling that person and do NOT respond to the email or text.
