PASTORS NOTES

In the Diocese of Jefferson City, the number of priests available to meet the sacramental and pastoral needs of the faithful has diminished, both in the seminary and among active priests. With a population of aging priests and fewer men entering the seminary, we find ourselves in a precarious situation. Currently, all the priests of our diocese are responsible for 1,600 people. This growing workload places great stress on priests and minimizes our service to the people of God.

The reasons for the shortage of men who study for the priesthood have many causes. I am concerned that we may feel indifferent to this critical shortage and feel that there is nothing we can do. To that I would respond with the words of Jesus: "Pray to the Lord of the Harvest to send laborers into his harvest."

Each child who is baptized is given to the Lord, just as Jesus was in his Presentation. Parents and godparents promise to raise the child in the Catholic faith and teach them about their particular role in the Kingdom of God. Do we take this seriously? Or are we trapped in the world's way of thinking, which places greater emphasis on entering the right university and earning a living? There is nothing wrong with those plans, but, as parents, it is your responsibility to teach your children that, as Christians, the Lord must be the first in their lives.

I urge parents to ask their children what they think the Lord wants from them. Whatever the answer, it is essential that we, as a community of faith, encourage, support and challenge our young people, no matter what their vocation, to put God first. Only then can we see an increase in vocations to the priesthood.
