PASTORS NOTES

In today's Gospel Jesus tells his listeners a parable about humility. In that time and place seats of honor were very important markers of a person's position in the community. Jesus goes against the usual way of doing things and tells us that we should not promote ourselves, but let others show us honor.

His listeners must have been confused and a little bit insulted. He went against the way that polite society works in telling this parable.

The lesson, of course, isn't about seating at the dinner table, but it is about humility and is a warning against the sin of pride.

Remember the time that Jesus washed the feet of the disciples? Peter could not believe his eyes! The Master doing the work of a slave? It was unheard of in their world (and in ours.)

Jesus showed the meaning of true humility on that day and set an example of humility lived out in service to His disciples.

Do we show humility in our actions as Christian believers to each other? To strangers? It is sad to say that we are seeing a lack of common civility in our world today: It's all about me! I must be first in line, and everyone should wait on me and my needs. That kind of attitude is a sure sign that we are living in the sin of pride. Remember the words of the prophet Micah:

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does God require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

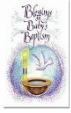
If you are reading this and say to yourself, "Father you are often not humble, but proud" you are very right. I struggle with pride every day. So pray for me please."

RELIEF PARENTS – ST. NICHOLAS ACADEMY

St. Nicholas Academy is a supportive living experience for boys from families that are under-resourced who want to give their sons every opportunity to succeed in school and life. St. Nick's partners with families and St. Peter Inter-parish School to provide this opportunity. St. Nick's is seeking Christian, married couples or single individuals who are willing to be part of a pool of relief parents. The role of relief parents is to care for the boys and home when the full-time house parents are off duty or away. Typically, the full-time house parents are off duty every fourth weekend from 9 AM Friday through 7 PM Sunday. Relief parents, on a rotational schedule, fill in during this time. They may also be asked to be on a call list to help fill in when the house parents are on vacation and/or sick. Relief parents receive an hourly wage, all legally mandated benefits and a compensation package that includes a private suite and all meals for the days on duty.
